# EMERGENCY FIRST AID AT WORK

#### Course Overview

This qualification is aimed at learners who wish to become emergency first-aiders in the workplace. This qualification meets the requirements for training emergency first-aiders in those organisations that have identified that staff need to be trained to this level within their first-aid needs assessment.

Topics covered include the role and responsibilities of a first aider, being able to manage an unresponsive casualty who is not breathing normally, being able to manage a casualty with external bleeding and being able to manage a casualty with a minor injury.



To complete this qualification learners should expect to undertake 7 hours of learning, with a minimum contact time, excluding breaks of 6 hours typically over 1 day. Learners are assessed by a practical demonstration and written/oral questioning and an examination.



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## EMERGENCY PAEDIATRIC FIRST AID

#### Course Overview

This qualification is aimed at individuals wishing to gain the knowledge and skills required to enable them to provide effective emergency paediatric first aid. It is intended for learners such as parents and relatives, pre-school or nursery staff, toddler group volunteers, childminders and nannies, au pairs and foster parents.

Topics covered include the role and responsibilities of the paediatric firstaider, how to provide first aid for an infant or a child who is unresponsive and breathing normally; who has a foreign body airway obstruction; who is suffering from shock or anaphylaxis.



To complete this qualification learners should expect to undertake 8 hours of learning, with a minimum contact time, excluding breaks of 6 hours. This qualification is assessed by a practical demonstration and written/oral questioning and an examination.



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### FIRST AID AT WORK

#### Course Overview

This qualification is aimed at learners who wish to become first-aiders in the workplace. This qualification meets the requirements for training emergency first-aiders in those organisations that have identified that staff need to be trained to this level within their first-aid needs assessment.

Topics covered include the role and responsibilities of a first-aider, being able to manage an unresponsive casualty who is not breathing normally, being able to manage a casualty with external bleeding, being able to manage a casualty with a minor injury, being able to conduct a secondary survey, being able to administer first aid to a casualty with suspected head and spinal injuries, and being able to administer first aid to a casualty with anaphylaxis.



To complete this qualification learners should expect to undertake 22 hours of learning, with a minimum contact time, excluding breaks of 18 hours over 3 days. This qualification is assessed by a practical demonstration and written/oral questioning and an examination.
